

Adrian served as Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Albania to the United Nations in New York from 2006 to 2009. After finishing his term as Ambassador, he served as Senior Legal Adviser to the President of the UN General Assembly, and later on as Political Director of the Leadership Panel, Joint Investigative Mechanism (JIM), a UN Security Council mandated body to identify perpetrators responsible in the use of chemicals as weapons in Syria. Adrian started his diplomatic career in 1991, when he became in charge of the United States affairs at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Albania. He remained with the Foreign Service until 1999, serving as Regional Officer in charge of China and the Far East from 1993 to 1997, and First Secretary/DCM at the Albanian Embassy in Beijing, China from 1997 to 1998. At the beginning of his career, Adrian was a Lecturer at Luigj Gurakuqi University in Shkodra, Albania.

Currently, Adrian is an Attorney and Counsellor at Law in New York City, focusing his practice in areas of international law and business transactions. He was an Adjunct Professor of Law at the John Marshall Law School in Chicago. During the course of his career, he was also an attorney in private practice in Chicago. Adrian serves as a pro bono legal adviser of the UN Women for Peace Association, a New York based not for profit organization committed to end violence against women and girls around the world.

He holds Bachelor Degrees in Political Science and Law from the University of Tirana, a Master's Degree in Diplomacy from the Mediterranean Academy of Diplomatic Studies in Malta, and a Master of Laws (LLM) in International Business and Trade Law from the John Marshall Law School in Chicago, USA. He is a member of the New York Bar.
